Setting the course to EASTER!



esus often stops in front of the vast sea. He lingers on the shores walking, stopping to eat on the beach, or gathering a crowd to speak to them from a boat, looking at the fishers working and choosing some of them as Apostles. Much of Jesus' life unfolds with the Sea of Tiberias as a backdrop. It is the largest lake of Galilee, a lake full of fishes and waterways that Jesus crosses several times.

The sea is a symbolic place, is an obstruction, a barrier. Human history is crossed, blocked and enclosed by the sea. The Gospel tells of the urge of Jesus who wants to cross this sea. The journey of Jesus, however, requires crossing the human heart.

The crossing of the sea, as of the heart of people, is like facing a storm. The sea and the heart will not let you pass through easily, but the psalm - 107 and 89 - say that God controls the sea and the storms. Jesus calms the storm because the love of God is stronger than the sea and the hearts of people. **There is no person who can feel excluded from God's love.**

Jesus walks on the water, while the disciples on the boat are struggling against the sea. He goes towards them reassuring: "Courage, I am, do not be afraid."

Jesus walks on the water, and puts under his feet adversity, obstacles, problems and all that prevents us from moving forward. Jesus opens his heart and ours.

ord, often we suffer the violence of the sea and the wind because fighting is difficult, we feel weak, and our will is unsure, we feel discouraged when faced with the difficulties of life and the power of evil. But you can do everything. Help us to open our hearts to your love. Give us the courage to take your hand that saves us from the violence of the waves. Do not let us sink in a sea of uncertainties and make our history your history because you boarded the boat of our life and you became our traveling companion.
